Suggested Materials:

6 3/4 "	40-099-02-6	2.3mm long-and-short figaro chain, antiqued brass
5 1/8"	40-099-08-6	2.8mm curb chain, antiqued brass
6	21-000-901-80	10x14mm Gemstone Harmonies™ puffed oval beads, tigereye/African turquoise
3	37-722-6	2" eye pins, antiqued brass
9	37-136-6	5mm round jump rings, antiqued brass
1	44-062	26mm I Ching coin replica
1	44-060-05	"Double Happiness" Asian coin charm, antiqued bronze
1	44-060-10	"Wealth" Asian coin charm, antiqued bronze
1	44-060-01	"Good Luck" Asian coin charm, antiqued bronze
1	39-340-6	10mm lobster clasp, antiqued brass

Tools: flush cutters, round-nose pliers, flat-nose pliers

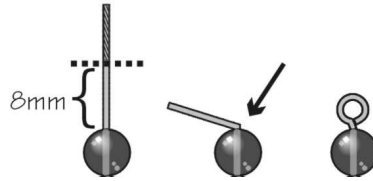
To make this design:

1. Add the gemstones to eye pins as pictured, and make simple loops.
(See techniques for making loops and jump-ring hint on the back.)
2. Cut figaro chain: one 2.5" piece, one 2" piece, one 1" piece and two 5/8" pieces.
3. Cut curb chain: one 2" piece, one 1.5" piece, one 1" piece, and one 5/8" piece.
4. Loop the 2" figaro and 2" curb chain pieces around the I Ching coin and attach the ends of the chains to a jump ring. (See jump-ring hint on the back.)
5. Repeat step 4 for the 1" figaro and 1" curb chain pieces.
6. Attach a jump ring to each end of a 5/8" figaro and 5/8" curb chain piece, and attach a lobster clasp to one of the jump rings.
7. Add the Asian coin charms to the remaining chain pieces, as pictured, and attach them to a jump ring.
8. Use the remaining jump rings to connect the coin and gemstone links together, as pictured.

NOTE: The finished length of this bracelet is 7". For a longer length, use longer pieces of chain, or add more gemstone links.

To make nice loops on head or eye pins:

1. String selected beads on the head or eye pin.
2. Keep about 8mm (1/3") of wire. Cut off any extra.
3. Use round-nose pliers to grasp the wire just above the bead, at the arrow, and bend sharply away from you.
4. Now use small round-nose pliers to grasp the tip of the wire, and bend it smoothly around the pliers down close to the beads.



Jump-ring hint:

When you open and close jump rings, twist sideways instead of “ovalling” them.
