Tools and supplies:

Rings & Things metal stamping tool kit (#69-299)

(contains; square steel block, chasing hammer, nylon hammer, two-hole metal punch)

dapping block & punches (#69-199)

chain-nose pliers (#69-271-03)

bent chain-nose pliers (#69-271-06)

flat-nose pliers (#69-271-08)

round-nose pliers (#69-271-02)

Eurotool® tungsten cutters (#69-271-93)

Win-OxTM oxidizer (#86-343)

0000 steel wool (from hardware store)

TIPS:

- Re-punch the existing holes in the hammered rings to better fit the 10mm jump rings. Punch a second hole, parallel to the first, to
 make the bracelet links.
- Use the ball end of a chasing hammer to gently tap pointy tips of the bead caps around rotund beads.
- Punch a hole in the center of copper flower blank and cut the loop off. Patina before riveting it into place with the two 6-petal cut outs. Once riveted, dome and punch a hole in this component for hanging.
- Oxidize the drop loops before attaching.
